


Adult Education & Literacy (AEL) Services

- Integrated Education and Training: A program that guides students into

 individuals that test at or above the functioning level of a NRS Level 3, of Low
 Intermediate Basic Education or for English Language Learner individuals that

Carpentry

Overview

This program is an introductory course that teaches the carpentry trade industry and basic framing skills. Students will learn how to construct and erect wood frame structures with an emphasis on the layout and construction of floors, walls, and roofs.

This course will cover terminology, how to read blueprints, and safety procedures for using hand tools, power tools, and structural materials. Students will learn the basic skills needed to become a residential carpenter.

Upon completion, students will earn a **Construction Framers Occupational Skills** Award.

Electricians

Overview

Basic electrician training provides the skills, knowledge, and hands-on experience required for a long-term career as an electrician. Electricians install electrical systems in structures as well as wiring and other electrical components, such as circuit breaker panels, switches, and light fixtures. They also read blueprints and adhere to the National Electrical Code® in addition to state and local codes.

Upon completion, students will earn an **Electrical Technician Occupational Skills** Award.

Plumbers, Pipefitters, Steamfitters



Overview

This course covers essential math, tool usage, and safety for plumbing. Students learn to measure, cut, join, and test plastic pipes and groove copper tubes. The curriculum includes steel pipe fittings, valves, and hanger/support installation. You'll also learn faucet and fixture selection and DWV system basics, preparing you for entry-level plumbing jobs.

Upon completion, students will earn a National Center for Education and Research Pipefitting Credential.
