Medical records technicians must earn at least a certificate, but employers generally prefer graduates of an associate's degree program. Entry-level wages average about \$12.00 per hour. The average hourly wage is \$17.67.

Medical records/health information technicians work in hospitals, physician offices, community health centers and other health care organizations. Using complex proprietary database systems, technicians manage, interpret and report data to maintain accurate records. Technicians who can maintain and troubleshoot computer systems have greater earning potential.
